









Glossary

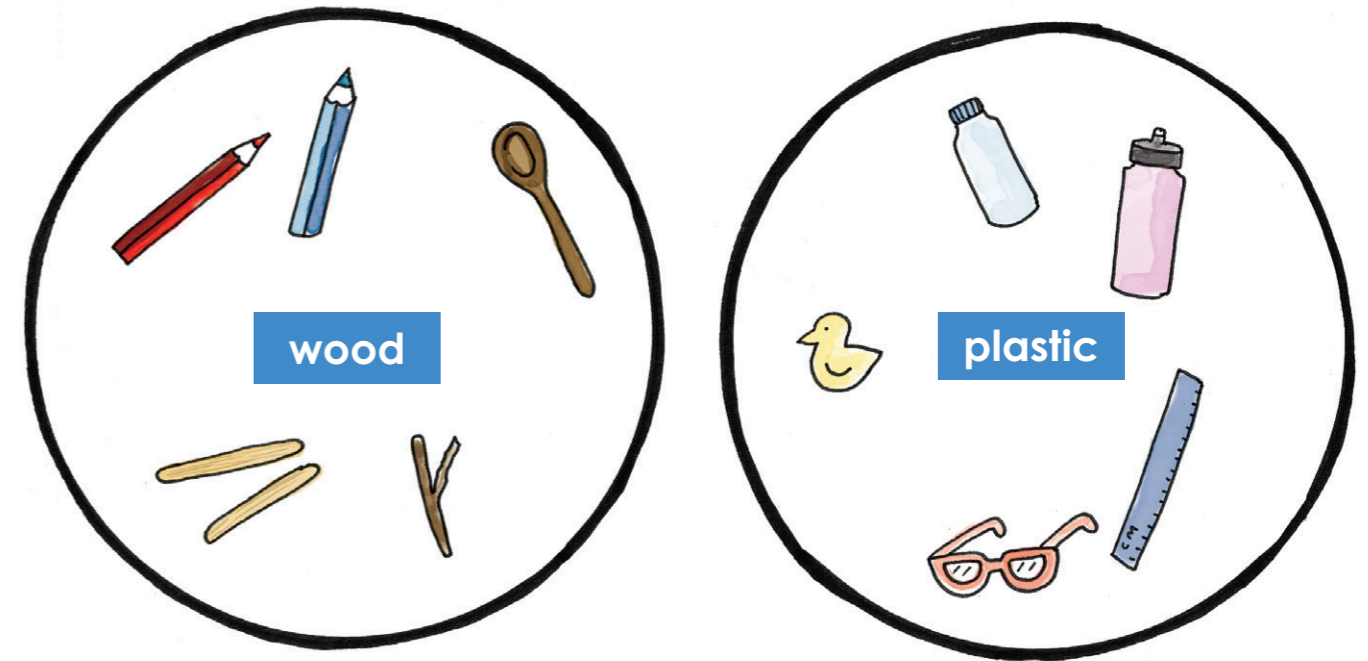
1	<b>absorbent</b>	soaks up water
2	<b>bendy</b>	easy to bend
3	<b>dull</b>	does not look bright and light
4	<b>hard</b>	not easy to bend or break
5	<b>material</b>	something that we make things with
6	<b>opaque</b>	you cannot see through it
7	<b>rough</b>	is bumpy when we touch it
8	<b>shiny</b>	looks bright and light
9	<b>smooth</b>	not bumpy when we touch it
10	<b>soft</b>	easy to bend or break
11	<b>stiff</b>	cannot be stretched or moved
12	<b>stretchy</b>	can be stretched out
13	<b>transparent</b>	you can see through it
14	<b>waterproof</b>	does not let water in

We can sort objects into groups by looking at what materials they are made from.

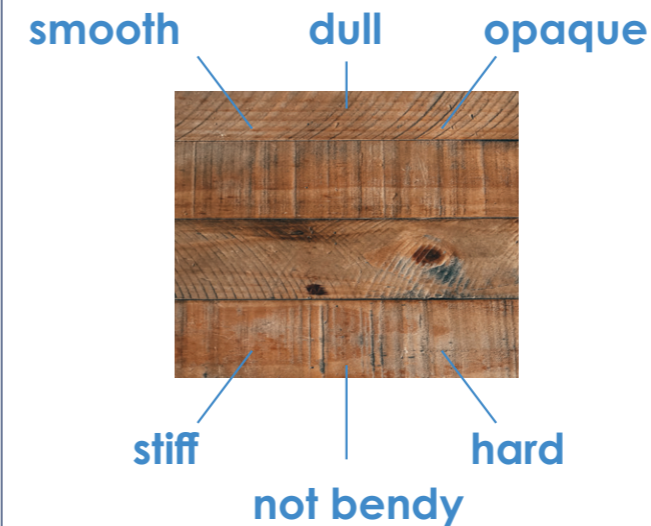


These objects have been sorted into ones that are made from plastic and ones that are made from wood.
